

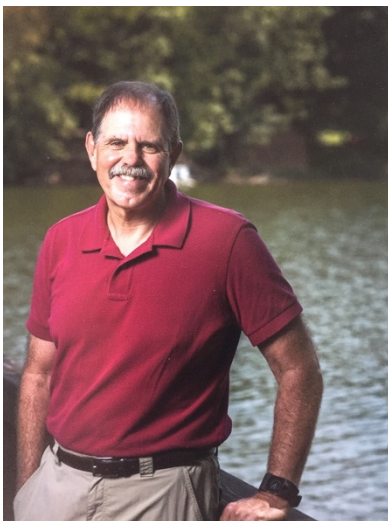
One Day Honey, One Day Onions: Life in Palestine by Dr. Michael Connor

Dr. Connor will talk about the struggles and frustrations of Palestinians living in East Jerusalem and the West Bank. You're invited to explore what their life is like, and learn about challenges facing the youth and perspectives on hope.

Dr. Michael Connor first visited Israel and the West Bank in October 2012 as part of a mission trip arranged by Mission Opportunities Short Term (MOST) and Christmas Lutheran Church, Bethlehem. He leads the Palestine Ministry at St. John's Lutheran Church in Salisbury, North Carolina.

In 2017, Dr. Connor spent 3 months in Palestine and Israel as a volunteer Ecumenical Accompanier, providing "protective presence" for marginalized people like Bedouin shepherds and schoolchildren in the South Hebron Hills area of the West Bank. The Ecumenical Accompaniment Programme is under the auspices of the World Council of Churches.

Dr. Connor is a retired biostatistician with over 40 years of professional experience in health care analytics and research.

The World Council of Churches' Ecumenical Accompaniment Programme in Palestine and Israel (WCC-EAPPI) was created in 2002 by the World Council of Churches based on a letter and an appeal from local church leaders to create an international regional presence.
